As the second of three dashboards addressing the broadly-defined business climate in San Diego County, this dashboard helps illustrate how San Diego's affordability stacks up to our competing metropolitan areas of Austin, Boston, Denver, Los Angeles, Portland, Raleigh, San Francisco, San Jose and Seattle. The San Diego metro data presented in this dashboard is county-wide, as the geographic boundary of the metro is identical to that of the County of San Diego.

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HOW FAR INCOME GOES


Affordability is the ratio of cost of living versus income. The table below uses the per capita income in the competitor metros to calculate the income needed in San Diego to maintain current spending patterns. San Diego ranks 6th in per capita personal income and 9th in overall affordability.


SALES TAXES

The effective sales tax differs throughout San Diego County, as some cities have passed local sales taxes. All cities within the County pay a half percent sales tax for regional transportation infrastructure. In the graph below, cities within San Diego County are presented in color showing the California state tax (gold), the infrastructure tax (red), and the locally passed taxes (blue).

TYPICAL HOUSEHOLD SPENDING

Average annual income before taxes in San Diego is \$77,805. The figure below shows the typical spending in each major expenditure category as a percentage of average income.



COST OF HOUSING

As of August 2016, the median price for a single family home in San Diego County was \$567,000. Average rent for a one-bedroom apartment in San Diego County was \$1,368.
