**SAN DIEGO (September 16, 2025)** – The San Diego Regional Chamber of Commerce has issued the following statement regarding the San Diego City Council voting to pass a \$25 minimum wage for tourism-related jobs:

"We are deeply disappointed by today's City Council vote to approve the \$25 minimum wage mandate. This shortsighted policy will drive up costs for businesses and families alike, adding to the already high cost of living in San Diego without addressing the region's underlying affordability crisis," said San Diego Regional Chamber of Commerce President and CEO, Chris Cate.
